	conservation activities through spring and summer in the Great Fen,
	one of the most important habitat restoration projects in Europe,
	diverse in wildlife and wildlife habitats. You will be involved for half of
	your time in restoration management.
Specific Tasks	Assist with planning and undertaking survey and monitoring including spring and summer bird transects, bird ringing (early mornings), aquatic and terrestrial plants surveys, aquatic and terrestrial invertebrates, amphibians (evenings) water voles, small mammals, bat surveys (nights) and use of remote detection equipment, water quality sampling, ground water monitoring, fixed-point photomonitoring, trail camera surveillance, drone photography.
	Assist with data handling, manipulation and analysis, incl. bat sonogram analysis.
	Participate in practical habitat management tasks including post and rail fencing, stock fencing, boundary clearance, mowing and raking. Also, step, stile, gate, hide & bridge building. Signage and waymarking.

	completing risk assessments, tools maintenance and site
